Markdown is a text-to-HTML conversion tool for web writers. Markdown allows you to write using an easy-to-read, easy-to-write plain text format, then convert it to structurally valid XHTML (or HTML).

LINKS

To have a clickable link just enclose link in angle brackets

<<https://example.com>>

If you want a link with a title, put the title in square brackets [] and the url in parentheses (), like so:

Here is [my report](<https://example.com/report.pdf>)

Which produces:

Here is [my report](#)

IMAGES

To embed an image, put an exclamation mark before the square brackets:

![Alt Text](url)

![A Cat](<https://example.com/cat1.jpg>)



BLOCKQUOTES

If you need to quote someone, the format is the same as email quoting:

> This is a blockquote with two paragraphs. Lorem ipsum dolor sit amet,
> consectetur adipiscing elit. Aliquam hendrerit mi posuere lectus.

> Vestibulum enim wisi, viverra nec, fringilla in, laoreet vitae, risus.
